2009 Hunt Reservation Form

Hunters are to arrive the day before their hunt and are responsible for the following:

- Their own personal gear
- Colorado hunting license which can be purchased after arrival
- Gun or bow with appropriate ammunition
- Clothing

We provide semi-guided hunts that include Deer, Elk, Antelope, Pheasant, Duck, and Prairie Dogs with one guide for every two clients, living quarters, food, and transportation to and from Colorado Springs Airport or Denver International Airport (DIA).

Colorado Hunting Licenses may be purchased upon arrival using your credit card or personal check.

Transportation from your home to Colorado Springs or DIA is your responsibility. We will have scheduled pickup times at the airport to pick up hunters. Shipping, meat processing, and taxidermy fees are the responsibility of the hunter.

To reserve your hunt for Pheasant and Prairie Dogs, a deposit of 50% of the hunt price is required. **The deposit is non-refundable.** The balance of 50% is due on arrival in certified funds.

Note: We cannot assure you of a spot until we have received your deposit.

List of Essential Hunt Items

Rifle:

It is important to bring a rifle with a scope you are familiar with. Have your rifle sighted in 2-3" high at 100 yards. I cannot stress enough the importance of practicing shooting with your rifle.

Bow:

It is important to bring a bow you are very familiar with. Practice shooting distances from 20 to 80 yards. We will have a target here for you to shoot at.

Ammunition:

Two boxes will be enough. If needed, we can shoot your rifle here to check zero prior to your hunt.

Hunter Orange:

While in the field, rifle hunters must wear an orange vest and hat. Bring these items with you.

Clothing:

Weather is undetermined so bring both cold and warm weather clothing.

Gloves:

Two pairs of warm gloves for cold weather.

Coats:

I recommend having one warm coat for below zero weather and one lighter weight jacket for normal temperatures, 20 degrees and up.

Other Items:

Day pack, camera, film, binoculars.
